DENVER AREA COUNCIL, BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, WELCOMES FUTURE SCOUTS TO ATTEND SCOUTS BSA LAUNCH EVENT 2/23/19

Lakewood, Colo—The Denver Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, will hold a FREE Scouts BSA Launch Party on Saturday, February 23, 2019, to welcome females into its older youth program, Scouts BSA. Future Scouts are welcome to attend, and they may sign up to join Scouts BSA at the event. Activities available will include: archery, shooting sports, rock climbing, and the opportunity for girls to earn their first merit badge. Currently, 75 girls are registered to attend.

Scouts BSA, the older youth program (ages 11-17) previously known as Boy Scouts, became Scouts BSA on February 1, 2019, at which time girls began join. The Denver Area Council now has 140 girls registered in Scouts BSA, including 21 Troops. Scouts BSA is not co-ed and all Troops will continue to be all-boy or all-girl environments. With this change, girls will be able to earn the highly esteemed rank of Eagle Scout. The program will continue to offer fun and challenging activities that promote character development and physical fitness while encouraging youth to be leaders in their homes, schools, and communities.

In August of 2018, the Denver Area Council began welcoming girls into its Cub Scouts program (ages 5-10). A total of 756 girls joined the Denver Area Council's Cub Scout program in 2018. Cub Scout dens continue to be all-boy or all-girl environments as well.
