

Suggested Packing List for Camp Cris Dobbins

(Units may provide a different version based upon their experiences.)

Individual Scout Equipment:

- Health form and waivers (submitted online in CampDoc prior to camp)
 - Medication that you take regularly in **original container with name on it. No pill organizers!**
- Scout Uniform and Belt
- Socks and Scout Socks (7 or 8 pair)
- Shorts and Scout Uniform Shorts (5-7)
- 5-7 T-shirts (no tank tops) to wear during day
- Shoes (completely closed) or Hiking Boots
- Shoes for showers and aquatic areas
- Cap or hat for sun protection
- Underwear (7-8 pairs)
- Pajamas or sleeping clothes
- Light jacket
- Sleeping Bag
- Pillow
- Cot or sleeping pad
- Tent (if not using camp provided tents)
- Personal first aid kit **WITHOUT medications**
- Poncho or rain jacket (we suggest rain suit)
- Towel
- Washcloth
- Soap and Shampoo
- Toothbrush and Toothpaste
- Comb or brush
- Other personal hygiene items
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Pocket knife and Totin Chip
- 10 Essentials
- Backpack "daypack"
- Sunscreen **with your name written on it**
- Insect repellent **with your name written on it**
- Swimsuit
- Scouts BSA handbook
- Water bottle with name and troop number written on it
- Spiral notebook
- Pens/pencils
- Spending money (we suggest at least \$100)

Optional:

- Camera
- Bible or Prayer Book
- Work Gloves
- Dirty Clothes Bag
- Watch
- Warmer Clothing if you get cold easy

MARK EVERYTHING WITH SCOUT'S NAME AND TROOP NUMBER

For ATV Safety Course, bring boots that cover your ankle, long sleeve shirt, and long pants.

For Horses, pants are required.

Personal valuables (watches, wallets, money, chargers) should not be left out in the open at camp.

Completely enclosed shoes are to be worn at all times unless you are in your tent, at the pool, at the lake or in the shower.

What not to bring /isn't allowed:

- Expensive personal item(s)
- **ANY** type of firearms, ammunition or archery equipment, or anything that resembles those items, including water guns, airsoft etc.
- Knives that are bigger than three inches
- Any weapons
- Alcohol, tobacco products, vape pens, drugs, etc
- Fireworks, fire starters, lighters
- Skateboards, motorized bikes/scooters etc
- Inappropriate games or video games/devices

Pack Youth medications, a swimsuit and towel in a daypack or at the top of bags. These items will be required before setting up your campsite.

YOUTH MEDICATIONS:

We want every Scout to stay healthy and safe while having an awesome time at camp! To help with that, **our Health Lodge is stocked with many common over the counter (OTC) medications—so you don't need to send those unless your Scout needs something specific.**

Important Info for All Youth Medications: Under Colorado law, all youth medications must be checked in with our health staff when you arrive at camp. This includes both prescription and OTC medications. Here's what you need to know:

- Emergency meds (like inhalers or epinephrine) can stay with the Scout but must be accompanied by a Contract to Carry.
- All medications must be in their original containers with clear instructions and labeled with the Scout's name and troop number.
- **No pill sorters, baggies, or unlabeled containers—we can't dispense meds unless they're properly packaged.**
- No medical marijuana or herbal supplements are allowed at camp.
- All youth medications will be returned to the unit Scoutmaster at check-out.
